At the Port: What to Expect



Most cruise ships dock at the **Freeport Harbor** (also known as the Freeport Cruise Port), located several miles from downtown and the island's beaches.

At the port you'll find:

Unlike some Caribbean ports, the cruise terminal itself is primarily an arrival point, with most attractions requiring a short taxi ride or shore excursion.

Taino Beach



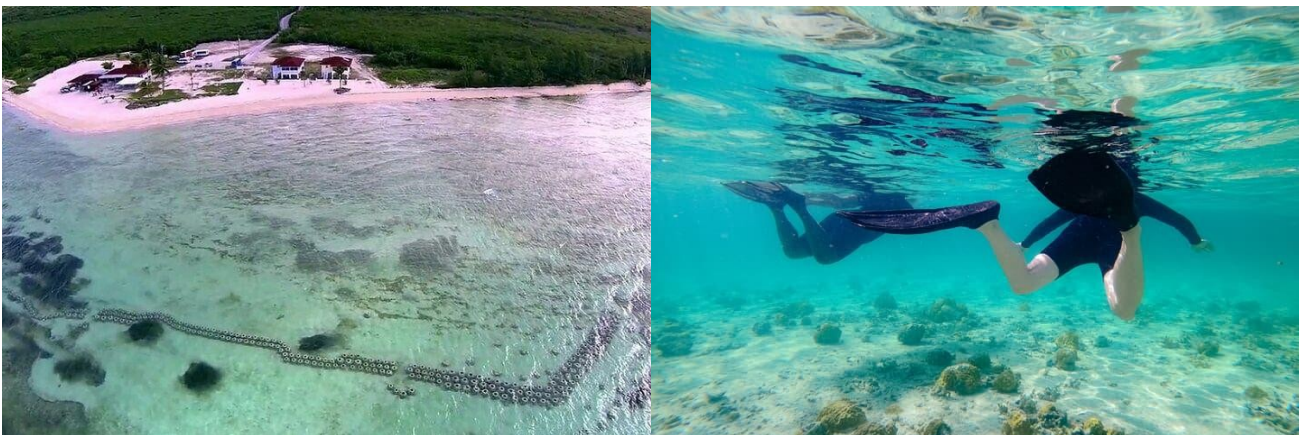
A favorite among cruise visitors.

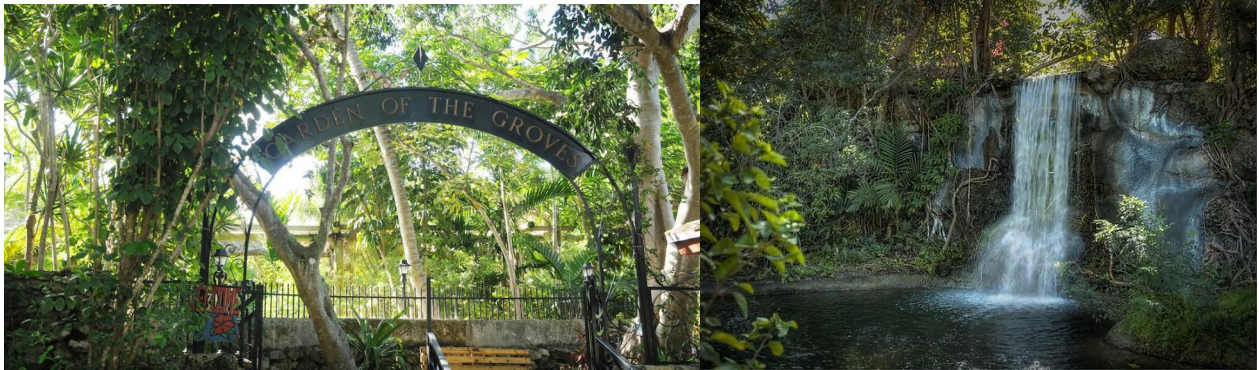

Weather Throughout the Year

Grand Bahama enjoys warm weather throughout the year.

Winter (Dec–Feb)

- Highs: 75–80°F
- Comfortable temperatures
- Lower humidity

Spring (Mar–May)

- Highs: 78–84°F
- Warm and sunny

Summer (Jun–Aug)

- Highs: 86–91°F
- Hot and humid
- Afternoon showers possible

Fall (Sep–Nov)

- Highs: 80–87°F
- Warm temperatures
- Lower humidity later in the season

Ocean temperatures remain comfortable for swimming year-round.

Hurricane Season

Official hurricane season:

June 1 – November 30

Peak activity:

- August
- September
- October

Cruise lines monitor weather closely and may adjust itineraries if necessary.



Transportation

Getting around Freeport is simple.

Options include:

Most beaches and attractions are approximately **15–25 minutes** from the cruise terminal.

Taxi fares are generally fixed to popular destinations—confirm the fare before departing.
