Cruise ships dock at **Port Zante**, located just a short walk from downtown Basseterre.

Originally built to transport sugar cane, the **St. Kitts Scenic Railway** now takes visitors on a relaxing journey around much of the island.

# Weather Throughout the Year

St. Kitts enjoys a warm tropical climate year-round.

## **Winter (December – February)**

- Highs: **80–83°F (27–28°C)**
- Comfortable humidity
- Ideal sightseeing weather

## **Spring (March – May)**

- Highs: **81–85°F (27–29°C)**
- Warm and sunny

## **Summer (June – August)**

- Highs: **86–90°F (30–32°C)**
- Hot and humid
- Brief afternoon showers possible

## **Fall (September – November)**

- Highs: **83–88°F (28–31°C)**
- Warm temperatures
- Slightly higher chance of rain

Trade winds help keep the island comfortable throughout the year.

## Hurricane Season

Official hurricane season runs from:

**June 1 – November 30**

Peak activity typically occurs:

- August
- September
- October

Cruise lines closely monitor weather conditions and adjust itineraries when necessary.

Travel insurance is highly recommended.

## Getting Around

Transportation options include:

- Taxi
- Island tours
- Cruise excursions
- Rental cars (driving is on the **left** side of the road)

Most major attractions are within a **15–30 minute** drive of Port Zante.

Taxi fares are generally fixed between popular destinations.

If this is your **first visit**, we highly recommend combining the **St. Kitts Scenic Railway** with **Brimstone Hill Fortress** if your schedule allows. You'll experience both the island's breathtaking scenery and its fascinating colonial history.

If you're returning to St. Kitts, spend the day exploring **Cockleshell Beach**, **Timothy Hill**, or take a ferry to **Nevis**. Many repeat cruisers discover that the quieter side of the island becomes their favorite.
