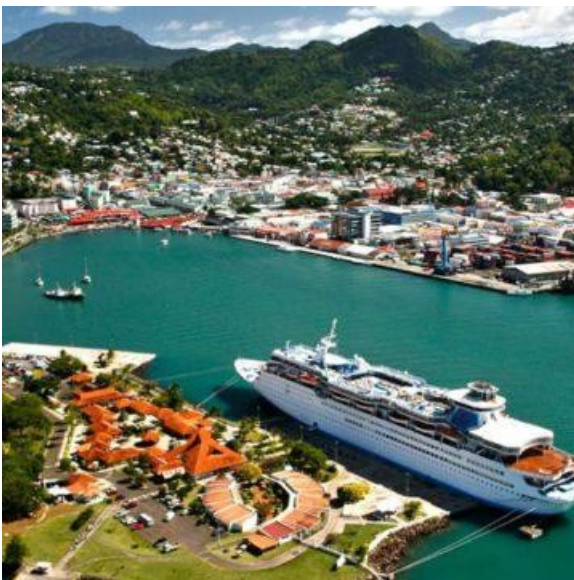

📍 Where Do Cruise Ships Dock?



Cruise ships typically dock at one of two terminals in **Castries**, the island's capital.

Point Seraphine

The larger and more modern cruise terminal featuring:

- Duty-free shopping
- Restaurants
- Local vendors
- Taxi stand
- Excursion meeting areas
- Visitor information

La Place Carenage

Located closer to downtown Castries.

Passengers can easily walk to:

- Local markets
- Restaurants
- Shopping
- Historic sites

Both terminals provide excellent access to the island's most popular excursions.

The Pitons



No visit to St. Lucia is complete without seeing **The Pitons**.

These two volcanic peaks are:

- A UNESCO World Heritage Site
- The island's most famous landmark
- One of the Caribbean's most photographed locations

Many excursions combine a scenic drive or catamaran cruise with breathtaking views of the Pitons.

Sulphur Springs & Mud Baths



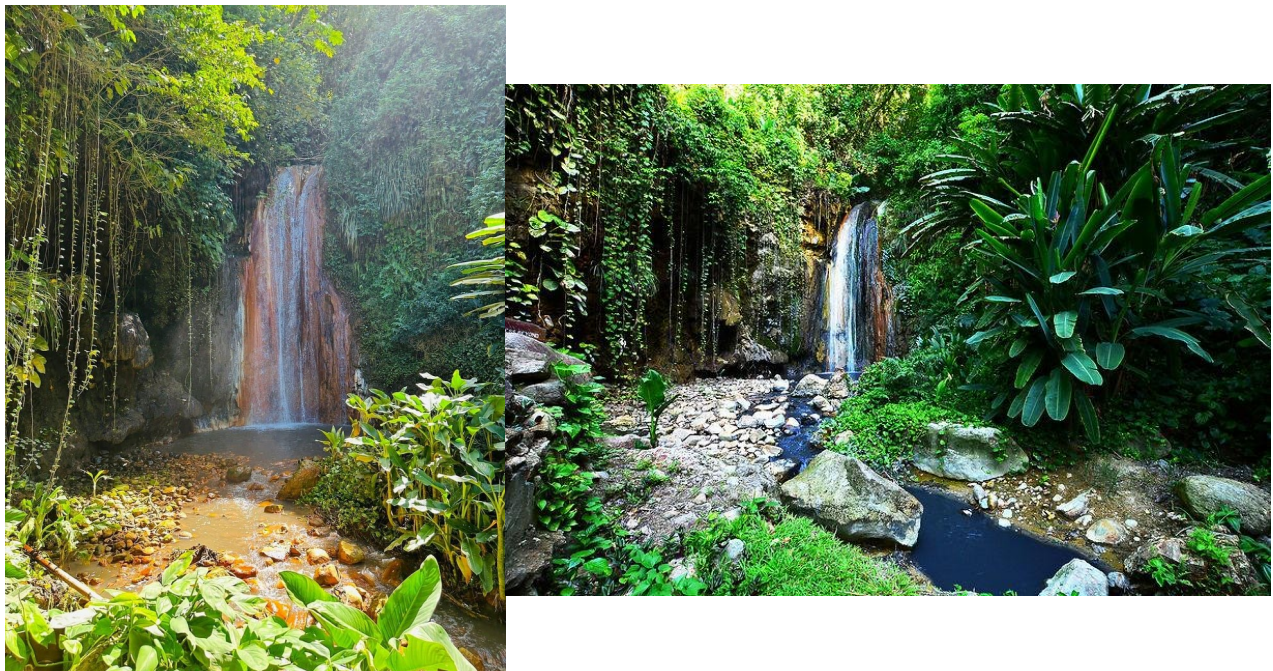
Often called the "**World's Only Drive-In Volcano**," Sulphur Springs is one of the island's signature attractions.

Visitors can:

- Walk around the geothermal area
- See bubbling sulfur pools
- Soak in mineral-rich mud baths
- Rinse off in warm natural springs

Many believe the volcanic mud has skin-softening benefits.

Diamond Falls Botanical Gardens



Located near Soufrière.

Features include:

A peaceful stop often combined with the mud baths.

Weather Throughout the Year

St. Lucia enjoys a tropical climate year-round.

Winter (December – February)

- Highs: **81–84°F (27–29°C)**
- Comfortable humidity
- Excellent sightseeing weather

Spring (March – May)

- Highs: **82–86°F (28–30°C)**
- Sunny and dry

Summer (June – August)

- Highs: **87–90°F (31–32°C)**
- Warm and humid
- Brief afternoon showers

Fall (September – November)

- Highs: **84–88°F (29–31°C)**
- Warm water
- Fewer crowds

The island's mountains often create brief tropical showers that quickly give way to sunshine.

Hurricane Season

The Atlantic hurricane season runs from:

June 1 – November 30

Peak activity usually occurs between:

- August
- September
- October

Cruise lines monitor weather conditions carefully and adjust itineraries when necessary.

Travel insurance is always recommended.

Getting Around

Transportation options include:

- Taxi
- Cruise excursions
- Rental cars (driving is on the **left** side of the road)
- Water taxis (at some locations)

Many of the island's most popular attractions are **45–90 minutes** from the cruise port because of the mountainous terrain. Plan accordingly and book excursions that allow plenty of time to return to your ship.



What to Pack

Bring:

St. Lucia is one of the few Caribbean islands where we almost always recommend booking a shore excursion rather than staying near the port. The island's greatest treasures—the Pitons, volcano, waterfalls, and rainforests—are located farther from Castries, and they're absolutely worth the drive.

If this is your first visit, a tour that combines **The Pitons, Sulphur Springs, Diamond Falls, and a catamaran return to the ship** offers one of the best shore excursion experiences anywhere in the Caribbean.
