Highly recommended if you want to experience both coastal and interior Alaska.

## **August**

Excellent for:

- Whale watching
  - Fishing
  - Comfortable weather
  - Beginning fall colors

## **September**

Often overlooked.

Advantages:

- Smaller crowds
- Lower prices
- Beautiful fall colors
- Possible Northern Lights
- Snow returning to mountain peaks

Depending on the season, you may encounter:

- Harbor seals
- Brown bears
- Black bears
- Moose
- Caribou
- Dall sheep
- Mountain goats
- Bald eagles

Every day is different, making wildlife viewing one of Alaska's greatest surprises.

## Weather

Many first-time visitors expect Alaska to be much colder than it actually is.

Typical summer temperatures:

- May: **45–60°F**
- June: **50–65°F**
- July: **55–70°F**
- August: **50–68°F**
- September: **45–60°F**

Layering your clothing is far more important than bringing heavy winter gear.

## What to Pack

Bring:

- ✓ Waterproof rain jacket
- ✓ Layered clothing
- ✓ Comfortable walking shoes
- ✓ Hat
- ✓ Gloves (especially May & September)
- ✓ Sunglasses
- ✓ Binoculars
- ✓ Camera
- ✓ Small backpack
- ✓ Refillable water bottle

Don't forget a waterproof cover for your phone or camera during excursions.

## Alaska Travel Tips

- Book excursions early, especially helicopter tours and bear viewing.
  - Pack in layers—you may experience sunshine, rain, and cool temperatures in the same day.
  - Bring binoculars for wildlife and glacier viewing.
  - Don't spend the entire cruise indoors. The best scenery is often on deck.
  - Keep your camera ready—you never know when you'll spot a whale or bald eagle.
  - If your budget allows, consider adding a land tour to experience Alaska beyond the coastline.
