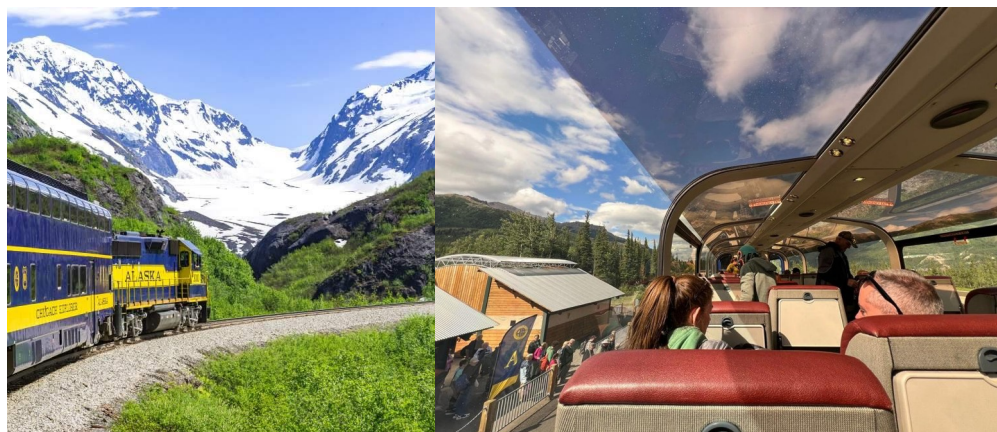

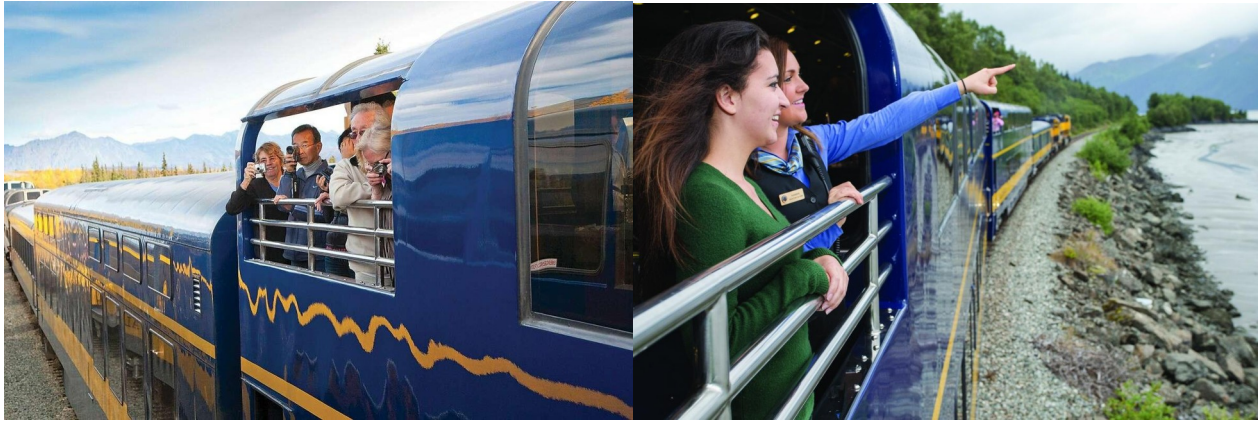
Passengers frequently spot:

 - Bring binoculars.
 - Keep your camera ready for wildlife.
 - Use a faster shutter speed when photographing from the moving train.
 - Clean your camera lens often to reduce glare from windows.

If this is your first trip to Alaska, I strongly recommend combining your cruise with a CruiseTour that includes the railroad. Seeing the coastline from a cruise ship is incredible, but riding through Alaska's interior gives you a completely different perspective of the state. Together, they create the kind of vacation you'll be talking about for years.

One final piece of advice: don't spend the entire trip in your seat. Walk to the outdoor viewing platform whenever you can. Feeling the fresh Alaska air while watching mountains, rivers, and maybe even a moose or bear pass by is one of those moments that reminds you why Alaska is truly unlike anywhere else in the world.
