Cruise Port Information



Unlike many cruise ports, **Bar Harbor is a tender port.**

This means:

- Your ship anchors offshore.
- Smaller tender boats transport passengers to town.

- Allow extra time to return to the ship.
- Cruise lines usually provide complimentary tender service.

Once ashore, downtown Bar Harbor is compact and easy to explore on foot.

Acadia National Park



The area's biggest attraction is **Acadia National Park**, one of America's most visited national parks.
