Highlights include:

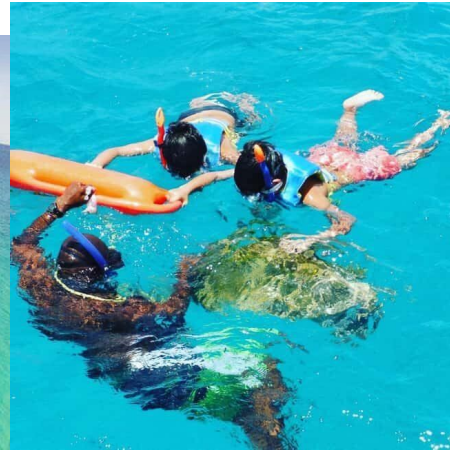

## **Weather Throughout the Year**

Barbados enjoys warm tropical weather year-round.

### **Winter (December – February)**

- Highs: **82–85°F (28–29°C)**
- Low humidity
- Ideal sightseeing weather

### **Spring (March – May)**

- Highs: **83–87°F (28–31°C)**
- Sunny and warm

### **Summer (June – August)**

- Highs: **86–90°F (30–32°C)**
- Warm with cooling trade winds

### **Fall (September – November)**

- Highs: **85–89°F (29–32°C)**
- Warm temperatures
- Occasional tropical showers

Trade winds help keep Barbados comfortable throughout the year.

## **Hurricane Season**

The Atlantic hurricane season officially runs from:

**June 1 – November 30**

Barbados sits on the southeastern edge of the Caribbean and is **less frequently affected by hurricanes** than many islands farther north. While tropical storms are still possible, direct hurricane strikes are relatively uncommon.

Cruise lines monitor weather carefully and will adjust itineraries if necessary.

Travel insurance is always recommended.

Taxi fares are generally fixed for popular cruise destinations.

## Know Before You Go: Camouflage Clothing is Prohibited

Barbados has strict laws regarding **camouflage clothing**. At the time this guide was published, **camouflage-patterned clothing and accessories are prohibited for civilians**, regardless of your nationality.

This includes items such as:

- Shirts
- Shorts
- Pants
- Dresses
- Hats
- Jackets
- Backpacks
- Purses
- Swim cover-ups
- Children's clothing

These restrictions exist because camouflage patterns are reserved for the **Barbados Defence Force** and other authorized personnel.

If you're arriving on a cruise, it's best to **leave all camouflage items on the ship** to avoid potential issues when going ashore.

**Premium Travel Group Tip:** Even something as simple as a camouflage baseball cap or backpack could attract unwanted attention. When packing for Barbados—and many other Caribbean destinations—choose solid colors or other patterns instead.
