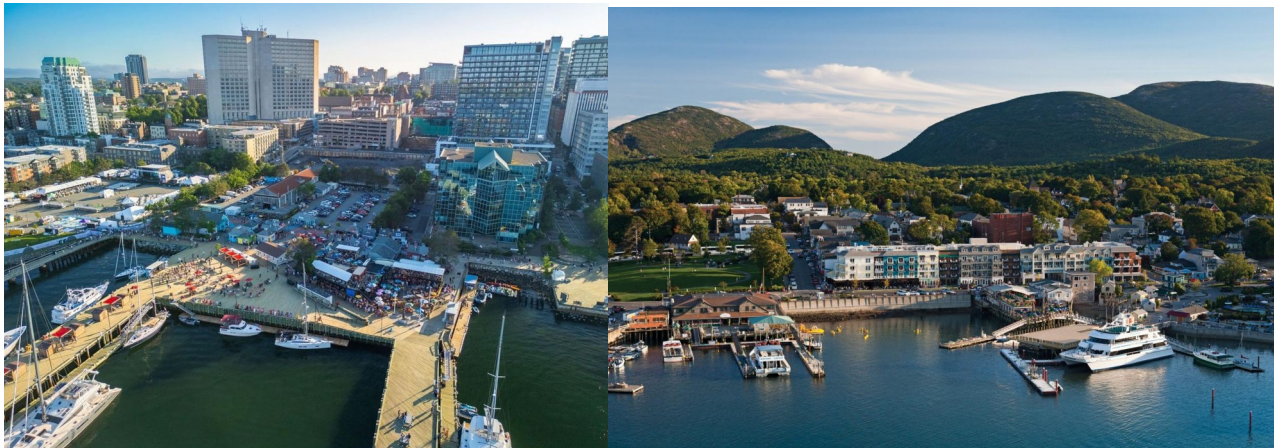

Fall Foliage Timing



Peak color varies slightly each year, but generally:

Late September

- Northern Maine
- Northern Québec

Early October

- Acadia National Park
- Québec City
- Cape Breton
- New Brunswick

Mid-October

- Boston
- Southern New England
- Coastal Massachusetts
- Rhode Island

Nature doesn't follow a calendar exactly, so foliage timing changes slightly each season.
