Where Do Cruise Ships Dock?



Most cruise ships dock at the **Mega Pier** in Willemstad.

From the pier, it's about a **10–15 minute walk** to the historic downtown.

The port area includes:

The walk into town is flat, scenic, and well worth it.



Explore Willemstad



Willemstad is one of the most beautiful cities in the Caribbean and has been designated a **UNESCO World Heritage Site**.

Don't miss:

Handelskade

The famous row of colorful Dutch colonial buildings that has become Curaçao's signature postcard view.

Queen Emma Floating Bridge

Known locally as the "**Swinging Old Lady**," this floating pedestrian bridge connects the districts of **Punda** and **Otrobanda**.

When ships enter the harbor, the bridge opens by swinging to the side—a fun sight if you happen to catch it in action.

Fort Amsterdam

Built in 1635, this historic Dutch fort remains an important government building today.

Cas Abao Beach

Weather Throughout the Year

Curaçao enjoys one of the Caribbean's most pleasant climates.

Winter (December – February)

- Highs: **82–86°F (28–30°C)**
- Comfortable trade winds
- Dry season

Spring (March – May)

- Highs: **84–88°F (29–31°C)**
- Sunny and warm

Summer (June – August)

- Highs: **87–91°F (31–33°C)**
- Warm with cooling sea breezes

Fall (September – November)

- Highs: **86–90°F (30–32°C)**
- Mostly sunny
- Minimal rainfall

Trade winds make Curaçao comfortable throughout the year.

Hurricane Season

The Atlantic hurricane season runs from:

June 1 – November 30

Fortunately, Curaçao lies **well outside the traditional hurricane belt**, making direct hurricane impacts extremely uncommon.

This makes Curaçao one of the Caribbean's most reliable destinations for cruising year-round.

Getting Around

Transportation options include:

- Licensed taxis
- Rental cars
- Cruise excursions
- Public buses

Approximate travel times:

- Downtown Willemstad – **10–15 minute walk**
- Mambo Beach – **10 minutes**
- Cas Abao Beach – **35 minutes**
- Grote Knip – **45 minutes**
- Shete Boka National Park – **45 minutes**

Taxi fares are generally fixed by destination, and drivers can provide fare estimates before your trip begins.

Many first-time visitors spend their entire day in Willemstad—and while it's one of the Caribbean's most beautiful cities, don't overlook the island itself.

If time allows, combine a walk through the colorful streets of **Punda and Otrobanda** with an afternoon at **Cas Abao Beach** or **Grote Knip**. You'll experience both Curaçao's unique Dutch-Caribbean culture and some of the clearest water anywhere in the Southern Caribbean.

If you're a snorkeler, don't miss the opportunity to swim with sea turtles or explore one of the island's vibrant coral reefs.

Joe's Logbook

One of my favorite experiences in Curaçao was visiting the **Blue Curaçao Distillery**. Before my visit, I thought it was just another flavored liqueur, but learning the history behind it completely changed my perspective. The story of how the island's unique **Laraha citrus fruit** became the inspiration for one of the world's most recognizable liqueurs is fascinating.

My favorite part of the tour was definitely the **tasting room**. I was surprised by just how many different flavors they produce—not just the famous blue version! One of the fun facts I learned is that many of the different flavors and colors come from **natural ingredients like fruits, herbs, flowers, and spices**, not just artificial flavorings.

If you're looking for something a little different than another beach day, I highly recommend visiting the distillery. It's a fun experience, you'll learn a little island history, and chances are you'll discover a new favorite flavor before heading back to the ship.
