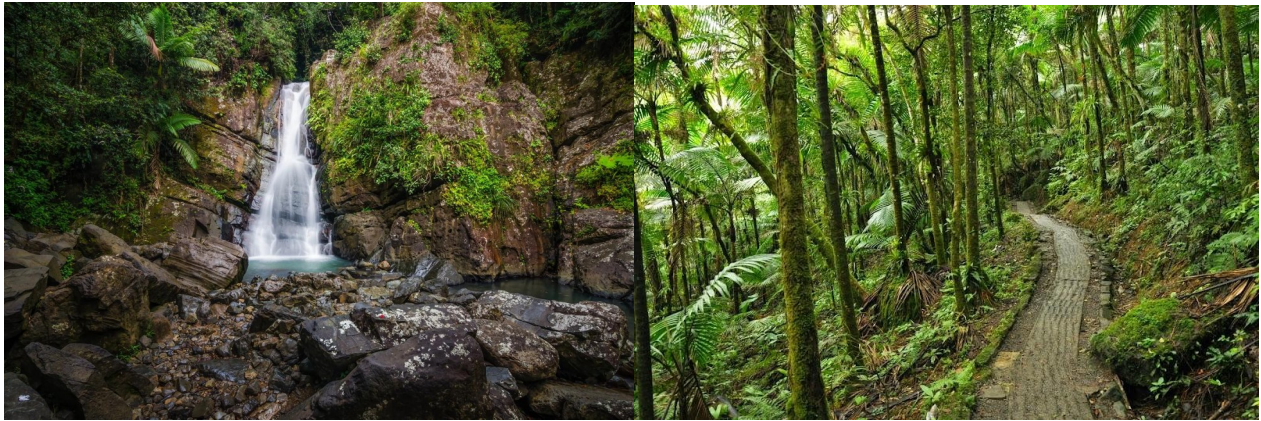


El Yunque Rainforest Guide

Explore the Caribbean's Only Tropical Rainforest in the U.S. National Forest System

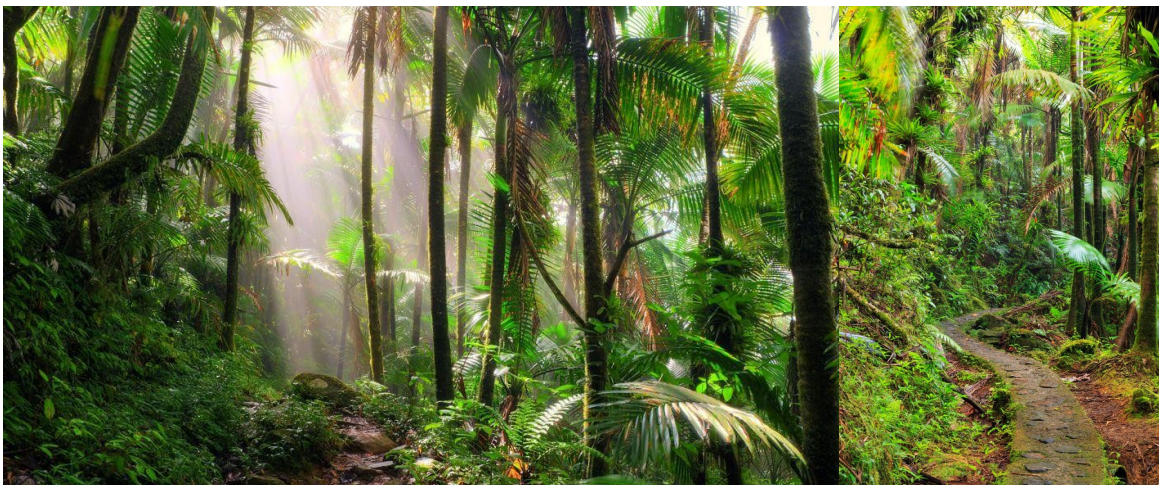


Rising above Puerto Rico's northeastern coast, **El Yunque National Forest** is one of the Caribbean's most extraordinary natural treasures. Covering nearly **29,000 acres (11,700 hectares)** of lush mountains, waterfalls, rivers, and tropical forests, El Yunque is the **only tropical rainforest in the U.S. National Forest System**.

For cruise visitors arriving in **San Juan**, El Yunque offers a completely different side of the Caribbean. Instead of white-sand beaches and turquoise water, you'll discover mist-covered peaks, towering palms, colorful flowers, singing tree frogs, and cascading waterfalls.

Whether you're hiking through the forest, cooling off beneath a waterfall, or simply taking in the panoramic mountain views, El Yunque is an unforgettable experience for nature lovers.

What Makes El Yunque Special?



El Yunque receives more than **100 inches (250 cm)** of rain annually, creating one of the richest ecosystems in the Caribbean.

The forest features:

- Tropical rainforest
- Cloud forest
- Rivers and streams
- Waterfalls
- Scenic mountain overlooks
- Hundreds of plant species

The combination of elevation and abundant rainfall creates a cool, refreshing escape from Puerto Rico's coastal heat.

Beautiful Waterfalls



Several waterfalls can be enjoyed throughout the forest.

Popular stops include:

La Coca Falls

One of Puerto Rico's most photographed waterfalls, located just off the main scenic road.

Juan Diego Falls

A short hike leads to these beautiful cascading pools, where visitors may be able to cool off depending on conditions.

Seasonal rainfall affects water flow throughout the year.

Hiking Through the Rainforest



El Yunque offers trails for a variety of skill levels.

Popular hikes include:

- Mount Britton Trail
- Angelito Trail
- Juan Diego Trail
- El Yunque Peak Trail (when open)

Many trails lead to scenic overlooks, waterfalls, and unique rainforest habitats.

Wildlife & Plant Life



The rainforest is home to incredible biodiversity.

You may encounter:

-  Coquí tree frogs

- 🦜 Puerto Rican parrots (rare)
- 🦎 Lizards
- 🦋 Butterflies
- Tropical birds
- Giant tree ferns
- Orchids
- Bamboo groves

The tiny **Coquí** frog is famous for its distinctive nighttime call and has become a symbol of Puerto Rico.

👁️ Scenic Overlooks



Don't miss these panoramic viewpoints:

🗼 Yokahú Tower

One of the most popular overlooks, offering sweeping views across the rainforest and out toward the Atlantic Ocean.

🗼 Mount Britton Tower

A historic stone observation tower reached by hiking through the forest.

On clear days, the views are spectacular.



Visiting from a Cruise Ship



El Yunque is approximately **45–60 minutes** from the San Juan Cruise Port.

Visitors typically arrive by:

- Cruise line shore excursions
- Guided nature tours
- Rental car
- Private transportation

Many tours combine the rainforest with visits to local beaches or historic Old San Juan.



What to Bring



Pack:

- Comfortable hiking shoes
- Lightweight rain jacket
- Insect repellent
- Refillable water bottle
- Camera
- Small backpack

- Quick-dry clothing
- Swimsuit if your excursion includes waterfall pools

Rain showers can happen at any time, so be prepared.
