- Magen's Bay stretches for **nearly one mile (1.6 kilometers)**, making it one of the longest beaches on St. Thomas.
 - The beach has frequently appeared on lists of the **world's most beautiful beaches** published by travel magazines and websites.
 - Because the bay is naturally protected, the water is usually calm and ideal for swimming.
 - The famous viewpoint known as **Drake's Seat** overlooks Magen's Bay and is named after the English explorer **Sir Francis Drake**, who is said to have used the location as a lookout—though the story remains part of local tradition rather than confirmed history.
 - Magen's Bay is managed as part of **Magen's Bay Park**, helping preserve its natural beauty for future generations.
