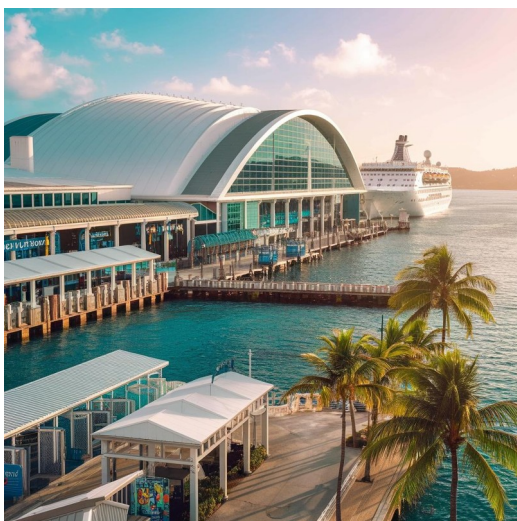
Your Complete Guide to Jamaica's Resort Capital, Beaches, Culture & Adventure

Unlike nearby Falmouth, where many excursions take you away from the port, Montego Bay offers plenty to see and do close to the cruise terminal, making it an excellent destination whether you want a relaxing beach day or an action-packed adventure.

Where Do Cruise Ships Dock?



Cruise ships dock at the **Montego Bay Freeport Cruise Terminal**, located just west of downtown.

Weather Throughout the Year

Montego Bay enjoys warm tropical weather year-round.

Winter (December – February)

- Highs: **81–84°F (27–29°C)**
- Lower humidity
- Excellent beach weather

Spring (March –May)

- Highs: **83–88°F (28–31°C)**
- Warm and sunny

Summer (June – August)

- Highs: **88–91°F (31–33°C)**
- Hot and humid
- Afternoon showers possible

Fall (September – November)

- Highs: **84–89°F (29–32°C)**
- Warm temperatures
- Tropical greenery at its peak

Trade winds provide welcome relief throughout the year.

Hurricane Season

The Atlantic hurricane season runs from:

June 1 – November 30

Peak activity generally occurs during:

- August
- September
- October

Cruise lines monitor tropical weather closely and adjust itineraries when necessary.

Travel insurance is strongly recommended.

Getting Around

Transportation options include:

- Licensed taxis
- Cruise excursions
- Private tours

Most major attractions are within:

- Doctor's Cave Beach – **10–15 minutes**
- Rose Hall – **20 minutes**
- Hip Strip – **10–15 minutes**
- Great River – **25–30 minutes**

Always use licensed taxis or trusted transportation arranged through your cruise line or travel advisor.
