What Is Rio Secreto?

Rio Secreto is part of the extensive underground cave systems that run beneath Mexico's Yucatán Peninsula.

The caves were formed over millions of years as rainwater slowly dissolved the limestone beneath the surface.

Many formations are still growing today, although only by tiny fractions of an inch over many years.

Rio Secreto is carefully protected to preserve its delicate environment.

Visitors help protect the caves by:

- Showering before entering
- Wearing provided safety equipment
- Following designated routes
- Never touching cave formations
- Staying with their guide

These conservation measures help preserve the caves for future generations.

Your guided tour typically includes:

- Wetsuit
- Helmet
- Headlamp
- Life jacket
- Water shoes

Professional guides provide safety instructions before entering the cave system.

- Rio Secreto is part of one of the world's largest underground cave networks beneath the **Yucatán Peninsula**.
 - The cave system remained largely hidden until it was accidentally discovered in **2004**.
 - The water flowing through Rio Secreto is naturally filtered through limestone, giving it exceptional clarity.
 - Some stalactites and stalagmites inside the caves have taken **thousands of years** to form.
 - The Yucatán Peninsula has **no major surface rivers** because rainwater naturally drains through the porous limestone into underground rivers like Rio Secreto.
