Cruise ships dock directly in **La Baie**, making it easy to begin exploring.

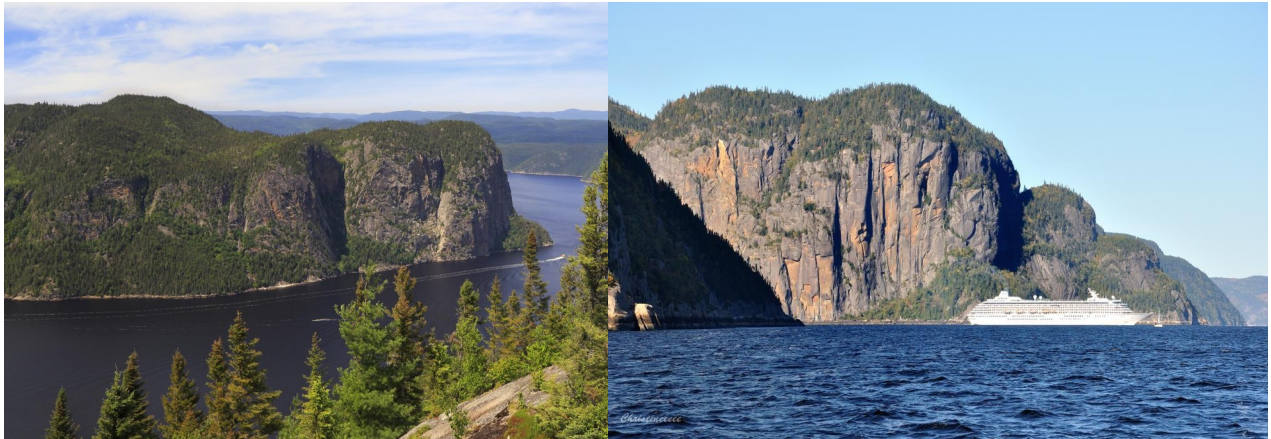
The port area includes:

The Saguenay Fjord



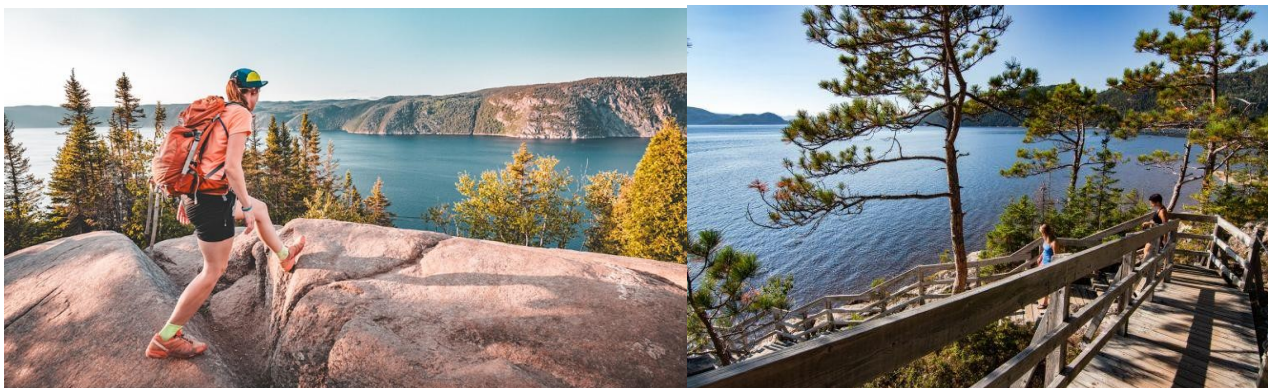
The magnificent **Saguenay Fjord** is the region's signature attraction.

 - Saguenay is one of the few cruise destinations where your scenic sail-in is considered just as memorable as your time ashore.
 - During autumn, the surrounding forests transform into brilliant shades of red, orange, and gold, making September and October especially beautiful.
