What Are The Baths?



The Baths is a unique coastal landscape formed by massive granite boulders that were created millions of years ago through volcanic activity and geological uplift.

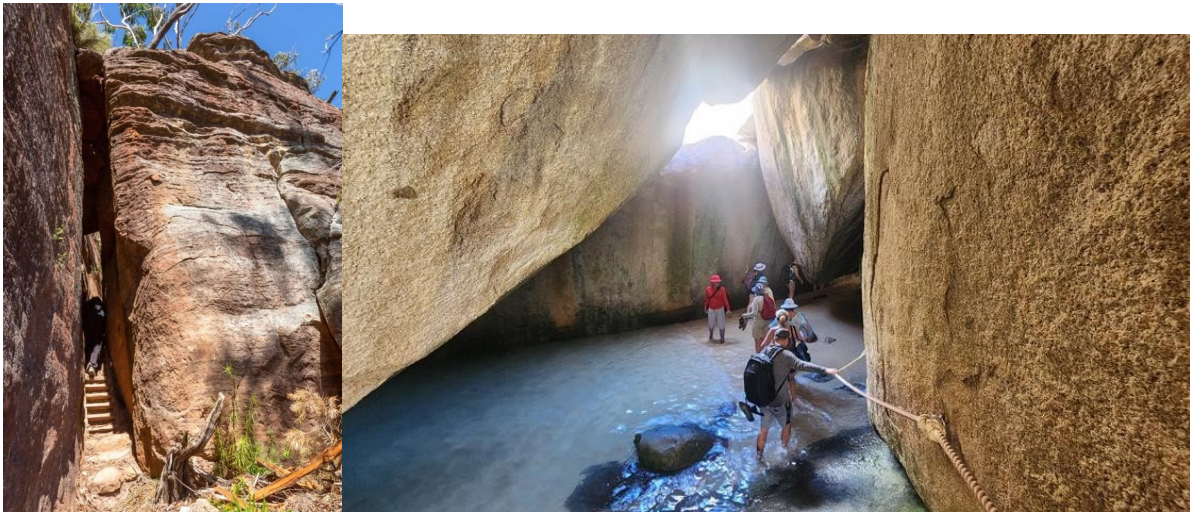
Over time, wind, waves, and rain carved out:

- Natural caves
- Narrow passageways
- Tide pools
- Hidden grottos
- Scenic viewpoints

The result is one of the Caribbean's most photographed destinations.



Exploring the Boulder Trail



Most visitors follow the famous trail that winds through the giant rocks.

Along the route you'll experience:

- Wooden staircases
- Rope-assisted climbs
- Narrow rock tunnels
- Shallow pools
- Sunlit caverns
- Beautiful ocean views

The walk is moderate in difficulty and includes uneven surfaces, so comfortable footwear is recommended.



Devil's Bay Beach



At the end of the trail lies **Devil's Bay**, one of the most beautiful beaches in the British Virgin Islands.

- Calm turquoise water
- Excellent snorkeling
- Swimming
- Relaxing scenery

Visibility is often excellent, making it a popular snorkeling destination.

- Ferry from Tortola
- Catamaran excursion
- Speedboat transfer
- Direct tender (for smaller ships)

Because access involves walking over uneven terrain, it's important to choose an excursion that matches your mobility level.



What to Bring



Recommended items include:

- Water shoes or sturdy sandals
- Swimsuit
- Towel
- Reef-safe sunscreen
- Waterproof phone case
- Snorkel gear (if not provided)
- Refillable water bottle
- Small backpack

Water shoes are especially helpful when walking through the rocky passages.



Best Time to Visit



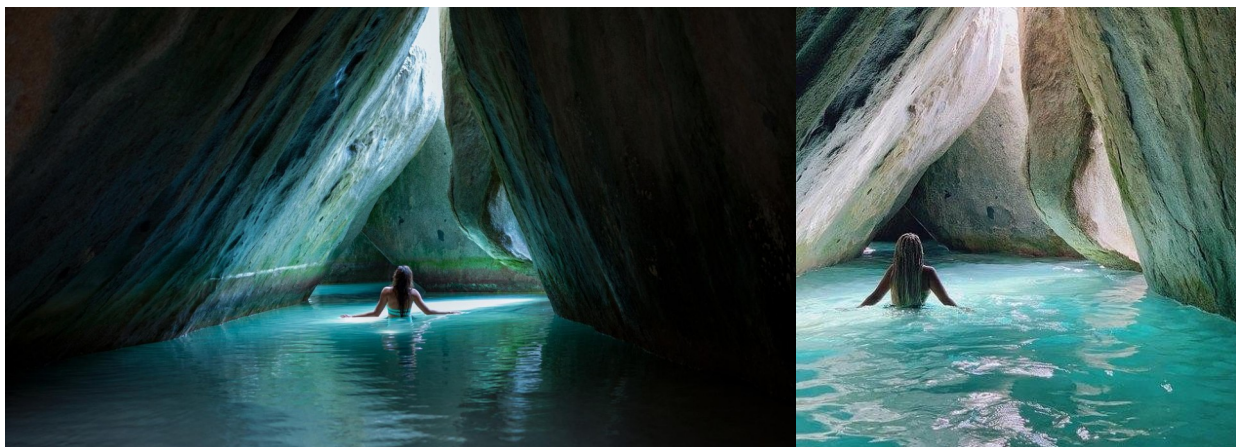
The Baths can be enjoyed year-round.

 - Using wide-angle shots inside the caves.
 - Including people for scale.
 - Taking panoramic beach photos at Devil's Bay.
 - Protecting your camera from water and sand.

- The giant granite boulders at The Baths are estimated to be **millions of years old** and are among the oldest exposed rock formations in the Caribbean.
- Some of the largest boulders measure **up to 40 feet (12 meters)** across.
- The Baths is part of **The Baths National Park**, one of the British Virgin Islands' most protected natural areas.
- Devil's Bay, located just beyond the boulder trail, is frequently ranked among the Caribbean's most beautiful beaches.
- The unique combination of giant granite boulders and turquoise seawater is rarely found anywhere else in the world.
