Cruise lines constantly monitor weather and will often:

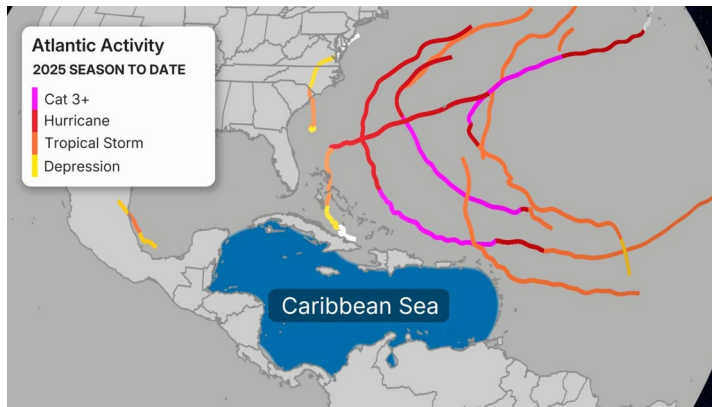
- Change itineraries

Hurricane Season Explained



The official Atlantic hurricane season runs from:

June 1 – November 30

Historically, the greatest activity occurs during:

- August
- September
- Early October

- Cruise captains work closely with professional meteorologists.
- Safety always comes first.
